Subject: chronic roadside erosion issue--Hwy 64 & Hunters Glen Lane

Dear Gentlemen,

We have a chronic erosion issue at the intersection of HWY 64 and Hunters Glen Lane.

The intersection handles a significantly heavier amount of traffic than most community intersections in that it services the Horse Shoe Post Office and school bus traffic, in addition to Hunters Glen/Cove community traffic.

The root cause of the erosion appears to be threefold:

- Water from hwy 64 drains onto the lower (pond) side of Hunters glen lane and channels to the shoulder.
- traffic turning onto hwy 64 toward Hendersonville cuts into the shoulder at the stop sign, allowing the drainage from hwy 64 to channel into the shoulder, form a rut, and enter the pond approximately 75 yards from the intersection.
- Traffic, especially trucks hauling trailers gaining access to the Post Office, use the space as parking, further eroding the shoulder.

This has created the following problems:

- runoff water has channeled into the space between the edge of road and fence.
- Runoff water then enters pond at pond access road.
- Water is eroding pond dam.
- That section remains wet most of the time.

We need a permanent repair to this chronic issue. My opinion is that a permanent fix to this chronic issue includes:

- A concrete curb and drainage adequate to handle runoff from hwy 64 should be installed to the Hendersonville side of the intersection of Hwy 64 and Hunters Glen Lane.
- the shoulder between the paved edge of Hunters Glen Lane and the fence along the pond side of Hunters Glen Lane should be hardened to accommodate heavy traffic from the post office. If such hardening is impossible, the shoulder should be curbed with concrete, with road drainage to the pond.

The Hunters Glen/Cove community has tried to maintain the shoulder, but cannot accomplish the corrections to the root cause of the issue. Recent attempts include filling/sloping eroded shoulders and installing swales along the first 75 yards of Hunters Glen Lane to divert street water into the pond.

If helpful, I can meet with you at your convenience to discuss resolving the root cause of this problem,
